Racial Justice

Immigration

• **UUs for Social Justice** has now made it easy to contact elected officials to urge a pathway to permanent residence for Dreamers. An article on this—with links to a General Assembly Action of Immediate Witness as well as to the site for communicating with elected officials—appeared in the August *Heirloom*. (Rebecca) On August 20, an announcement was made at church and people could use a computer in the Great Hall to contact elected officials. (Louise).

Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, and Other Issues

Writing Letters to Statehouse Officials. The letters are to stop Ohio HB68, which bans gender-affirming care for minors. HUUC had an online letter-writing campaign. Bill status: https://www.legislature.ohio.gov/legislation/135/hb68. This bill has passed the House and is now in the Senate Government Oversight Committee (which has four Republicans and one Democrat). Plans are to update the letter-writing campaign to send letters to senators. (Russ)

Housing and Homelessness

• Found House Interfaith Housing Network. https://www.foundhouse.org/. St. John's UU Church will host families the week of October 15. Rae Jane is a co-coordinator as host. Sign-up genius has been created for people to volunteer for jobs. People can sign up to help anytime, not just on a specific congregation's night. At Heritage Church, people donated stuffed animals and an outreach offering was used to buy stuffed animals and other items to donate to children staying at St. John's. (Rae Jane)

Governmental Reform

"Citizens Not Politicians" is a group that is collecting signatures to put an Ohio Constitutional Amendment on the ballot in November 2024. The amendment would establish a citizens' group to do election redistricting. Current/former politicians, lobbyist, and large donors would be prohibited from participating. The proposal is similar to the approach now used in Michigan and Colorado. (Russ)
